

ICC won't use Waki report, say officials

THE International Criminal Court will neither use the Waki nor the KNCHR report to prosecute perpetrators of the post election violence.

Two ICC officials touring Western and Nyanza provinces said even the witnesses who testified before the two commissions may not be called upon to testify at The Hague.

The two were speaking in Kisumu on Wednesday during a forum with civil society organisations drawn from Nyanza and Western.

They said there is a misconception among majority of Kenyans that ICC chief prosecutor Luis Moreno-Ocampo will use the Waki and KNCHR lists of suspects in his prosecution.

Clause Molitor and Mohammed Kheir said the two reports were only relevant

during the initial stages of ICC investigations in the country. "They simply helped us build a foundation for our investigations," said Kheir.

He further said that currently, they are carrying out independent investigations to find the truth about the

violence that rocked the country after the last general elections.

The two were among a group of five ICC officials who visited Kisumu last month and held a closed-door meeting with civil society members and victims of the post-election violence.
